# I Samuel 16:1-13

- After God rejected Saul as king, He sent the prophet Samuel to Jesse in Bethlehem, to anoint one of his sons as King.
- One by one, Jesse brought his sons to Samuel. When Samuel saw the first son, Eliab, he thought that he was God's choice because he was tall and good-looking. God told him that he was not God's choice, and that man looks at the outward appearance but God looks at the heart.
- When God rejected the first seven sons, Samuel asked if Jesse had any other sons. Jesse said there was one more son, and brought him in from caring for the sheep.
- The last son, David, was God's choice. Samuel anointed him with oil, and the Spirit of God came upon him.
