I Samuel 17:1-52

- Jesse sent David to take some food to his brothers who were in Saul's army. When David got there, a giant named Goliath came from the Philistines and challenged them to send a man to fight him, but no man would go.
- David told Saul that just as he had fought a lion and a bear, he could fight against this giant by the power of God.
- David took his staff, sling, and five stones. When David used his sling against Goliath, he fell down and died.

- How has God showed His faithfulness to you?
- How has God helped you?
