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

Everybody TRUSTS in something or someone.

Think about that! We all TRUST in something.

We all have IFAITTH in something or someone.

Can you think of something or someone that you **TRUST** in?

We use **FAITTH** all the time. People who don't **TRUST** @@D still **TRUST** in something. They just unfortunately (for them), put their **TRUST** in something other than @@D. But, they still have **FAITTH** in something too, just not the one who can save them from their **SINS**.

People who don't **TRUST** in **COD** often make fun of those who have **FAITH** in **COD**, who **TRUST** in **COD**. It doesn't make sense, because they too have **FAITH** in something. They also **TRUST** in something for their lives. They **TRUST** in **money**, **power**, **science**, **education**, **church**, **family**, **and friends**, **etc**. Talk about how we show

TRUST and FAITH.

List ways we show TRUST and FANTIH:

This may help you – what do you rely upon? What do you depend on? What do you BELIEVE in? What do you put your confidence in? What are you committed to? THIS IS WHAT YOU TRUST!

This is what happens when we show **FAITH**. Our mind thinks about the possibilities; what will I put my **TRUST** in?

My mind thinks, "Who or what is worthy of my **TRUST**?" Then my will chooses, and the emotions follow. If it was a good choice, then good emotions follow. If it was a bad choice, then bad emotions follow.

So **FAITH** is $A _ T _ _ C _ N F _ _ C E in <math>\mathcal{COD}$; we choose to **TRUST**, we choose to **BELIEVE**.

So, why is it sometimes hard to **TRUST** @@D, to have **FAITH** in @@D? Why do you think?

Stop and talk about it! Was one of your answers, because I can't see @@D? Think about that, how many other things you can't see, but still **TRUST** them. Talk about the things you **TRUST** in, but can't see.

is IFAIITH and the end (the goal) is coming to @OD. The thing @OD likes about IFAIITH is what follows; we come to Him!

knows that people who really BELIEVE in Him, come to Him. And people who don't BELIEVE in Him, don't come to Him.

This is why @@D is pleased by **FANTIH**. He wants us to come to Him. He wants to have fellowship with us. This brings glory to Him.

1 Corinthians 1:9 says;

"God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of this Son,

Jesus Christ."

Then we read in 1 John 1:3;

...that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with this Son Jesus Christ."

wants us to walk in **FAITH** because He knows what happens in our lives. **FAITH** produces good things in us.


EOD knows that when our **FAITH** in Him is strong, we come to Him. And when our **FAITH** in Him is weak, we don't come to Him.

COD wants you to have FAITH. COD loves you so much and He knows that if you don't BELIEVE in Him and TRUST Him and have FAITH in Him. you will not come to Him.

In the 3st study we considered why GOD MADE us. It was to GLORIFY Him, to know Him and to fellowship with Him, to come to @@D.

> And if you don't walk by **FALTIH**, then you won't come to Him. If you don't come to Him, then that means you're **TRUSTING** in something else to help you through life.

By, we know that COD is the ONLY One that can really help us get through life because @@D has the power to work in our hearts and in the circumstances of our lives.



FAITH is so important with our relationship with @@D and here's why; You cannot have a close relationship with GOD if you don't TRUST Him.

The more you don't TRUST Him, the more you move away from Him.

Here's a REAL LIFE example of three young men who proved their FAITH in God by their active confidence in Him.

You might have heard of them: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Although they were in a foreign country as slaves, they were three friends who loved and served God. The time came when a law was made that everybody had to bow down and worship a huge gold image (statue) of the king, and if they didn't, they would be thrown into a fiery furnace. Well, that's a

problem because that law went against God's command not to worship any other God but Himself. Would these friends' Faith in God, be active at this time, or not?

The answer is yes! They **BELIEVED CODE** WORD to worship only **COD**. They acted upon it by standing while everybody around them bowed down.

They did this even when they didn't \(\frac{600}{000} \) like it. You can be sure they didn't \(\frac{600}{000} \) like being thrown into fire! They did this because \(\bigcirc \mathbb{O} \bigcirc \) promised a \(\bigcirc \mathbb{O} \) that He would be \(\bigcirc \mathbb{A} \) THIFUL to them, and He was! He saved them and didn't allow them to be hurt by the fire. Don't you want your \(\bigcirc \mathbb{A} \) THIFUL in \(\bigcirc \mathbb{O} \) to be active like that of these three young men?

Now we're going to talk about an important part of this verse: coming to @@D.

"...for he who comes to God..." so how do we come to GOD?

GOD wants to have fellowship with us. How do we do that?

The primary way we come to GOD and have fellowship

with Him, is through reading or listening to

His WORD, the BIBLE.

When we read the BIBLE we need to think differently than when we read any other book.

We need to understand that the BIBLE is a Spiritual book.

The BIBLE, the WORD of @OD, claims to be alive. Read Nebrews 4:12


"For the Word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

@@D wants us to know and understand this about the BIBLE.

Now, we know what reading the BIBLE means. So, how do we do that?

One of the best ways to read CODE WORD, the BIBLE, is to respond to what COD cave. Respond many to "cond back."

Below is an example of responding to **EDD** about what He said in His WORD.

You might respond,

"Lord, help me to trust and depend on You more and not to think I have all the answers. Help me to talk to You about everything in my life. Thank you that you will show me the right ways to go and the right things to do." That's responding to @@D and what He said in His WORD, the BIBLE.

You can ask yourself the question, "What did God say in what I just read in the Bible that I can respond back to Him?" You can also answer questions like, "Is there a promise to claim?" And, "Is there a warning to heed?" Other questions would be, "Is there a command to obey?" or "Is there a good example to follow?" You can respond back to @OD in prayer every time you read the BIBLE. That way you and @OD are having a

Don't forget! @@D wants to have fellowship with you! @@D wants to talk with you.

TWO-WAY conversation!

when you read the BIBLE and respond to what @OD has said, you need to respond personally and correctly; personally, like responding to what a friend has just said to you, and correctly, not changing anything that the BIBLE says, but responding to what was said.
