THE TRUE NATURE OF SAVING

Because the word "BELIEVE" is used in many ways and can mean different things, we are going to examine three beliefs of the various ways that people say that they BELIEVE in **GOD**.

The FIRST belief is:

The belief that there is a possibility that **GOD** may exist.

The very first verse in the BIBLE says

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." Genesis 1:1

Psalm 19:1 states,

"The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament (expanse of heaven) shows the work of his hands."

And later in Romans 1:20 it says

"For since the creation of the world Nis (God's) invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even Nis eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse."

People may Los K around at the world and say to themselves, "There must have been something that made all of this, it couldn't have just happened. Well, maybe there's a God out there. But I'm not sure, but I think it's possible. Maybe there's a God."

Some people are taught that **GOD** doesn't exist, but they **LogK** around and realize that someone must have **MADE** the world.

All people have to do is to **LOSK UP** into the heavens to see the evidence of a Creator; the evidence that there is a **GOD**. Even people in the remotest parts of the world have **BELIEVED** in a creator **GOD** by thinking about what

they see in **GOD'S** CREATION. **GOD** tells us in the BIBLE know that He exists simply by observing the things He

When you **Look** at a phone, you know someone **MADE** (**GREATED**) the phone; or a watch, someone had to have **MADE** it, it didn't just happen.

Do you BELIEVE that He is, that GOD exists?

We should not find it impossible or difficult to BELIEVE in **GOD**. This belief that **GOD** exists is the very least that is expected of those whom **GOD** GREATED.

The SECOND belief is:

The belief that **GOD** is real, but not following what He wants, not committing our lives to Him, and just doing what we want to do and really not caring about what **GOD** says is right or wrong (in the BIBLE).

Some people **BELIEVE** in **GOD**, but they don't give their lives to Him. They don't *love* Him. They agree that there is a **GOD** that exists, but they don't **BELIEVE** in a way that actually changes their lives because they don't **BELIEVE** in their hearts.

Deuteronomy 6:5 says,

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength."

So, it is possible to have a belief of **GOD** in your head, but not in your heart.

Many people **BELIEVE** that if they have the correct belief, all is well, all is right. But it can be a BIG mistake to think, "all is well" if I just have the correct belief!

In James 2:19 it says,

"You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe-and tremble!" Why do you think the demons "tremble"? To tremble means to be troubled by fear. These creatures **BELIEVE**; not only in **GOD'S** existence, but also in His power. They do not *love* and serve **GOD**. They have an understanding of who **GOD** is and that causes them to tremble!

So it is with many people! They may have a "head" belief about who **GOP** is, but they haven't given their lives (hearts) to Him and do not serve Him.


James is trying to communicate that head-belief is good, but it is heart-belief that is necessary for salvation. Let's think about that!

you've memorized some BIBLE verses, that makes you all right with **GOD**?

That would be like saying that because you stand in the middle of your garage

that makes you a car. **OR** because you go to McDonalds that makes you a "happy meal."

The THIRD belief is:




The belief that causes a person to give his or her life to the **LORD**.


This is someone that is a follower of *Jesus Christ* and His teachings.

When a person truly **BELIEVES** in the Lord *Jesus Christ*, that person receives forgiveness for his *SINS*; the result being a spiritual birth (being "born again"), being indwelt by the Holy Spirit and receiving His enablement to not be controlled by *SIN*.

If we have really given our lives to the Lord, there will be the proof or evidence in our lives.

Answer this question quietly to yourself... "Is there evidence in my life that I am a @ HRISTIAN?"





Some evidence in a person's life is that they treat others with kindness and not meanness. They aren't angry and but forgiving and loving. They aren't selfish, but they do things for others. They care about what *GOD* wants to do, so they read their BIBLE to find out. They talk to *GOD* in prayer. They ask *GOD* to help in obeying Him. They like going to church to learn about *GOD*.

James 2:20 tells us that

"...faith without works is dead."

We are not saved by our works, but our works (the things that we do in our lives, the way we live), give evidence of what we really BELIEVE. If we have really committed our lives to the Lord lesus, there will be ACTIONS in our lives to prove what we BELIEVE.

The apostle Paul states in Ephesians 2:8-10

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are this workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

If you are not yet a @HRISTIAN, it would be good to talk to someone today about giving your life to the Lord.

Write down two things that show evidence that you are a @ HRISTIAN.

James **BELIEVED** the same thing that the Apostle *Paul* wrote in *Ephesians 2:8-10*, that we are accepted by *GOD* by grace through **IFALITHM**. We can't be accepted by *GOD* on the basis of our works.

James just focused on the fact that if we really have **BELIEVED** on **Jesus Christ** and we follow His teachings, there will be proof by how we live.

If someone says to you "I am a firefighter. That is my job." Then you would expect that person to do what a firefighter does – put out fires and help people. **OR** if someone says to you "I am a doctor. That is my job." They too would be expected to do what a doctor does, tries to help sick people get well.

What James is saying is, that if you say you **BELIEVE** in *Jesus Christ*, then you will live that way!

Here are two little stories that hopefully will help you understand this idea of **BELIEF**.

There was a man back in the 1800's whose name was Charles Blondin. He was a French tightrope walker.

One of Charles Blondin's greatest accomplishments was in June of 1859 when he attempted to become the first person to


walk a tightrope that stretched over a quarter of a mile across the mighty Niagara Falls.


He walked across 160 feet above the falls several times, each time doing a different daring ACT — once in a sack, once on stilts, once on a bicycle, once in the dark, and once he even carried a stove and cooked an omelet!

On one occasion Blondin was waiting to perform across the tightrope again, when he noticed a young boy standing by, excited and curious with interest. Addressing the boy and pointing up to the rope, Mr. Blondin said, "Do you BELIEVE I can walk across that rope?" "Yes, I do," was the boy's reply. Mr. Blondin asked another question, "Do you BELIEVE I could carry you on my back and walk across?" Unhesitatingly came the answer "Yes, I do!" Charles Blondin bent down and replied, "All right! Jump up!" But the boy disappeared!

He had said that he had **BELIEVED**, but did he really? What kind of belief did this boy have? Was it a head belief or a heart belief?

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The second story goes like this...

A grocer was down in the cellar (basement) of his shop, when he noticed his small son standing at the open trap door. He called up, "Here I am, son, jump down". But the boy hesitated. "I can't, Daddy. I can't see you," he said. His father answered, "Trust me and jump and I will catch you." At his father's words, the boy jumped, because he believed his father.

To BELIEVE is to TRUST, to place full confidence in, to rest upon with FAIITHI.



The first two kinds of belief we LockED at were only "head belief." They were beliefs that did not involve TRUST. But, the third kind of belief was a "heart belief" because it involved TRUST and ACTION. The young boy in the first story displayed only "head belief". He was not willing to TRUST Mr. Blondin to carry him across the tightrope. He didn't REALLY BELIEVE. But the grocer's son had a "heart belief "in his father when he jumped into his arms even though he couldn't see him. He TRUSTED his father.

Hopefully, these two little stories will help you understand what we mean by

"FAITH is BELIEVING CODE WORD and ACTING upon it, no matter how I feel, because COD promises a GOOD RESULT."

Let's say what **FAITH** is together... Repeat it. "**FAITH** is..."

Which **FAITH** do you have? The disciples said to *Jesus*, "Increase our faith." in Luke 17:5.

FAITH, that is a saving **FAITH**, is a belief in **Jesus**, committing ourselves to Him, and **TRUSTING** in Him, as the grocer's boy **TRUSTED** and committed himself to his father.

We have been STUDYING about FAITH a lot. It's time to make sure you can say by memory Nebrews 11:6 and the **DEFINITION** of "FAITH." Practice together, then fill in all the blanks.

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




